

# Why we are still effectivley a colony by max sandler

Why Are We Still Effectively A Colony?

The case for a republic has been in the public conscious for many decades now, its peak was perhaps the 1999 Republic Referendum, and unfortunately it was unsuccessful. However following the release of a new ResearchNow poll indicating that 52% of Australians would support a republic, it is time to re-examine the issue.

In our system, Queen Elizabeth II of Great Britain is the person at the top of the political hierarchy. Whether you like it or not, she has the power to alter, strike or create laws and to sack the Prime Minister. A person who inherits assets from their family is one matter, a person who inherits the right to power is a different matter. Yes, the Queen has done many good things, but power should be built on merit, not inherited.





Therefore it is no longer suitable that she should rule over all Australians. Monarchy is simply incompatible with Democracy, and that is why we need an Australian Republic with an elected Australian leader. If we look at our Constitutional Monarchy, we can see that the Monarchy does little for our country. For most people, they know the Queen as 'the lady on our coins and banknotes, and all our institutions have 'royal' in their name. 
# Bacteria turns lead to gold by ari epstein

In the middle ages, alchemists dreamed of the Philosophers Stone, an object that could turn lead into gold. Now, scientists may have found the answer to the age old question, but it isn't a stone.

Cupriavidus metallidurans is a rod shaped bacterium. This bacterium lives in soils that have large amounts of heavy metals like lead and mercury. While the shells of gold that cover the bacteria are only a few billionths of a meter thick, they can clump together to form grains the size of sand grains.

The process starts when the bacteria encounters a gold ion. A gold ion is an atom of gold which has lost one or more of its electrons. Electrons are elementary particles that make up parts of all atoms. The gold ion can pass through the cell walls and cause damage. This is not the only ion present though. The bacterium needs trace amounts of copper to function, but too much is poisonous. The bacterium have a special enzyme called CupA, that disposes of excess copper. But when the gold comes in contact with the bacterium, it not only goes past the cell walls, but it stops CupA from working, releasing dangerous copper, harming the cell with both too much copper and gold ions.

Luckily the cell has a workaround. It has another enzyme calle CopA. This enzyme rips electrons off the copper and transfers them to the gold. This stabilizes both the copper and gold. The copper is slowly consumed, and the gold just builds up in the outer layers of the cell wall. When there is too much gold, the outer layer of the cell wall breaks, and the cell has a shell of gold. The cell sheds the shell, and leaves it somewhere. Then the gold slowly clumps together and forms grains the size of sand.


